

THIS SUNDAY WE CELEBRATE THE GREAT SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD. Before Jesus ascended into heaven, he told his apostles, and us as well, to "go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation."

HUMANITARIAN RELIEF - INDIA'S COVID-19 OUTBREAK

India is reeling from a devastating COVID-19 outbreak. In recent days, the country has been reporting more than 400,000 of new cases and 4,000 deaths every 24 hours. It is believed that the actual numbers are significantly higher. The medical system, funeral services and other social supports are unable to meet the country's needs at this time. The Archdiocese of Toronto will send donations through Development and Peace to Caritas Internationalis (please watch this video: http://bit.ly/CaritasIndiaRelief), an international confederation of Catholic humanitarian organizations that is already in India helping those who are suffering during this outbreak with:

- food at kitchens and distribution centres in slums, at migration transit points, etc.
- masks, sanitizers and hygiene kits to vulnerable communities
- psychosocial support and hotline services to traumatized and grieving people
- education campaigns on infection prevention and vaccination
- supporting the public healthcare system, donating expertise, facilities and equipment from Church-run clinics and hospitals
