PARISH ENVELOPES

THIS SUNDAY WE CELEBRATE THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD. This feast day invites us to reflect on the revelation of Christ to humanity. One principle episode that the Epiphany celebrates is the visit of the Magi. The Magi represents the Gentiles and all nations coming to know and worship Christ.

On this day, chalk and incense will be blessed in our church, which you will be able to take home, so that you may mark your house with the letters (C + M + B + 2022) They abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house."

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

The glory of the Lord has shone upon us, and shall ever be manifest among us, until the day of his return.

Through the rhythms of times and seasons let us celebrate the mysteries of salvation.

Let us recall the year's culmination, the Easter Triduum of the Lord: his last supper, his crucifixion, his burial, and his rising, celebrated between the evening of the 14th of April and the evening of the 17th of April.

Each Easter—as on each Sunday—the Holy Church makes present the great and saving deed by which Christ has forever conquered sin and death.

From Easter are reckoned all the days we keep holy. Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will occur on the 2nd of March. The Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on the 29th of May. Pentecost, the joyful conclusion of the season of Easter, will be celebrated on the 5th of June.

And this year the First Sunday of Advent will be on the 27th of November.

Likewise the pilgrim Church proclaims the Passover of Christ in the feasts of the holy Mother of God, in the feasts of the Apostles and Saints, and in the commemoration of the faithful departed.

To Jesus Christ, who was, who is, and who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, forever and ever. Amen.
