### PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

The Church celebrates the feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2. This feast is also known as Candlemas day, since the blessing and procession of candles is included in the liturgy.

Evening Holy Mass will begin with the blessing the candles, which will stay lit until the reading from the Gospel.

The blessed candles can be later lit in situations of fear, i.e. in extraordinary atmospheric phenomena or at the hour of death.

This year we ordered the sufficient number of candles. So, if you don't have one already, you will be able to obtain one before the Mass.

### WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE

Instituted by Pope John Paul II in 1997, World Day for Consecrated Life is celebrated on February 2<sup>nd</sup>. On that day, we celebrate those men and women who have devoted their lives to the Lord by living out the counsels of Poverty, Chastity and Obedience and pray for God's continued blessing upon them.

### BLESSING OF THE THROATS ON THE FEAST OF ST. BLAISE

The feast of Saint Blaise, Armenian bishop is celebrated on February 3rd. Since the eighth century, Saint Blaise has been venerated as the patron of those who suffer from diseases of the throat. The blessing of Saint Blaise is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick. It will take place at the end of the Mass, on Thursday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>.
